BE IT RESOLVED, that the Executive Director be authorized to negotiate Amendment 12 to Agreement PR00000689, Capital Grant Agreement for the METRO Green Line Extension Light Rail Transit Project (CP 1000899) with the Metropolitan Council and Hennepin County, extending the grant activity period from January 31, 2025, to December 31, 2028; and increasing the maximum grant amount by \$90,047,888, for a new maximum grant amount of \$1,168,125,592; that following review and approval by the County Attorney's Office, the Chair be authorized to sign the amendment on behalf of the Authority; and that the Controller be authorized to disburse funds as directed; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board approvals herein do not waive any obligations of the Metropolitan Council under any relevant agreement.

#### **Background:**

On May 31, 2018, the Hennepin County Regional Railroad Authority ("HCRRA") adopted Resolution 18-HCRRA-0027, committing up to \$199,548,000 of HCRRA funding to the Southwest Corridor Light Rail Transit (METRO Green Line Extension) Project (CP 1000899) ("Project"). On November 15, 2018, HCRRA adopted Resolution 18-HCRRA-0056, which among other actions authorized negotiation of a new grant agreement with the Metropolitan Council ("Council") and Hennepin County, Agreement PR00000689 (the "Agreement"), to replace prior funding agreements and be the sole funding source for all Project activities through the end of August 2019.

The Agreement was then negotiated and executed, with a not to exceed amount of \$434,901,943 in total funds from Hennepin County (up to \$347,921,554) and HCRRA (up to \$86,980,389). The funded activities included civil construction work authorized by the Federal Transit Administration ("FTA"), any pre-award authority activities requiring and receiving prior approval by the Hennepin County and HCRRA Boards, and ongoing overhead expenses and other professional services related to the Project.

The Agreement has since been amended 11 times. Each time, Hennepin County likewise approved negotiation of the same amendment on the same day as the HCRRA Board's approval. The amendments were as follows:

- Amendment 1 extended the term through September 30, 2019 (Resolution 19-HCRRA-0037).
- Amendment 2 extended the term through March 31, 2020, increased the maximum grant amount to \$553,456,897, and made other contract changes (19-HCRRA-0038).
- Amendment 3 extended the term through June 30, 2020, and increased the maximum grant amount to \$602,795,681(20-HCRRA-0012).
- Amendment 4 extended the term through August 31, 2020, and increased the maximum grant amount to \$677,765,449 (20-HCRRA-0031).

#### 24-HCRRA-0027

- Amendment 5 extended the term through November 30, 2020 (20-HCRRA-0039).
- Amendment 6 extended the term through January 31, 2022 (20-HCRRA-0052).
- Amendment 7 extended the term through June 30, 2022, and increased the maximum grant amount to \$878,080,704 (21-HCRRA-0039).
- Amendment 8 extended the term through December 31, 2022 (22-HCRRA-0019).
- Amendment 9 extended the term through June 30, 2023, and increased the maximum grant amount to \$978,080,704 (22-HCRRA-0045).
- Amendment 10 extended the term through January 31, 2024 (23-HCRRA-0018).
- Amendment 11 extended the term through January 31, 2025, and increased the maximum grant amount to \$1,078,080,704 (24-HCRRA-0003).

This Resolution would authorize negotiation of Amendment 12 to the Agreement, to extend the term of the grant to December 31, 2028, and to increase the maximum grant amount by \$90,047,888, for a new maximum grant amount of \$1,168,125,592.

This new funding would be contributed by Hennepin County, with no new funding provided by the Authority.

Through October 31, 2024, Hennepin County has paid approximately \$826 million towards its funding commitment, including \$40.2 million contributed under other agreements between the County and the Council. HCRRA has paid its full commitment of approximately \$199.5 million, including \$72.9 million contributed under other agreements between HCRRA and the Council. In addition to the funds contributed by Hennepin County and HCRRA, the Project budget also includes approximately \$1.3 billion in federal funding; \$218.9 million from CTIB, which has been fully paid to the Project; and certain other smaller funding sources.

**Impact/Outcomes:** Approval of this request will allow for continued construction activities for the METRO Green Line Extension.

This action supports the county's disparity reduction efforts by investing in transportation infrastructure that reduces climate impacts and gives people transportation choices and access to housing, jobs, schools, medical facilities, and other destinations of choice.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Hennepin County Regional Railroad Authority authorizes the Executive Director to negotiate Amendment One to Agreement PR00005488, Capital Grant Agreement for the METRO Blue Line Extension Light Rail Transit Project with the Metropolitan Council and Hennepin County, extending the grant activity period to June 30, 2026; increasing the Maximum Grant Amount by \$173,600,000 for a new Maximum Grant Amount of \$248,905,000, of which the Authority will contribute up to \$50,661,000 (CP 1000941) and the County will contribute up to \$198,244,000 (CP 1005877); and allowing the Project Decisions Board to authorize use of grant funds for project expenditures that cannot be paid with federal funds; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Authority authorizes the Chair to execute Amendment One to Agreement PR00005488, after review and approval by the County Attorney's Office; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Authority authorizes the Controller to transfer and disburse funds as necessary to carry out the intent of this Resolution.

#### **Background:**

Since the inception of the METRO Blue Line Extension Light Rail Transit (LRT) Project (CP 1000941), HCRRA has disbursed approximately \$54 million to the project through four separate agreements with the Metropolitan Council. The most recent agreement is PR00005488, Capital Grant Agreement for the Project, with the Metropolitan Council and Hennepin County. This Agreement established a maximum grant amount of \$75,305,000, of which the HCRRA contributed up to \$15,061,000 and the County contributed up to \$60,244,000. The Agreement's end date is December 31, 2024.

To date, approximately \$225 million has been obligated to the Project. This amount includes \$75 million from the current Capital Grant Agreement PR00005488; \$18.1 million provided by Hennepin County and CTIB pursuant to Agreement A177882A (nearly \$17 million in Hennepin County funds and nearly \$47 million in CTIB funds); \$82.8 million in CTIB funding through earlier agreements; and \$48.8 million in HCRRA funding through three separate agreements, most recently Agreement A176897.

This Resolution would authorize negotiation of Amendment One to Agreement PR00005488. This Amendment would extend the grant activity period to June 30, 2026, and increase the maximum grant amount by \$173,600,000, for a new maximum grant amount of \$248,905,000. Of this amount, Hennepin County would contribute \$198,244,000 and HCRRA would contribute \$50,661,000. The Amendment would also authorize the Project Decisions Board, subject to certain requirements, to approve use of grant funds for project expenditures that could not be paid for with federal funds.

The Blue Line Extension Project is currently in the engineering phase and published a Supplemental Draft Environmental Impact Statement on June 14, 2024. Primary activities during the grant activity period under the

proposed Amendment would include preparation of final environmental documentation and final design and engineering of the new route. Also included in the grant activity period would be the acquisition of project right of way. These activities would support the application for a Full Funding Grant Agreement (FFGA) to the Federal Transit Administration.

The official budget for the Project has not been updated since 2016. At that time, the total Project budget was \$1.536 billion, including a commitment of \$530.1 million from the County and \$149.6 million from HCRRA. These numbers do not reflect the current alignment, nor the cost escalation that has occurred over the past eight years.

Project staff roughly estimate that the current project budget, after accounting for price escalation and the new alignment, will be approximately \$3.2 billion, including a project contingency factor of 37.5%. New funding commitments, including from Hennepin County and HCRRA, will thus be required to complete the Project. Staff expect to seek updated commitments from the County and HCRRA after a project budget is finalized and prior to applying for an FFGA.

Current Request: Authorization to negotiate and execute Amendment One to Agreement PR00005488 with the Metropolitan Council and Hennepin County for the METRO Blue Line Extension Project (CP 1000941). extending the grant activity period through June 30, 2026, and increasing the maximum grant amount to \$248,905,000. BE IT RESOLVED, that the Hennepin County Regional Railroad Authority (HCRRA) Board of Commissioners adopts final tax levies of \$9,252,863 for debt service and \$24,747,137 for general operating purposes for a total of \$34,000,000 for year 2025; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the 2025 HCRRA budget, attached, be approved at \$34,136,313.

#### **Background:**

On September 17, 2024 the HCRRA Board of Commissioners set HCRRA's maximum levy for 2025 at \$34,000,000 with a budget of \$34,136,313 (Resolution 24-HCRRA-0018).

The proposed 2025 HCRRA budget supports new budget authority of \$9.6 million for the METRO Blue Line Extension (Bottineau) Light Rail Transit and \$5.8 million for Midtown bridges.

The 2025 HCRRA budget also includes \$9.8 million for maintenance of the 40 miles of corridor and staff support for transitways and oversight of HCRRA's infrastructure assets and operational needs.

**Current Request**: Adoption of final tax levies of \$9,252,863 for debt service and \$24,747,137 for general operating purposes for a total of \$34,000,000 for year 2025, and approval of the HCRRA 2025 budget of \$34,136,313.

**Impact/Outcome**: Adoption of the 2025 HCRRA levy of \$34,000,000 and budget of \$34,136,313 will support the capital, debt service, and operational needs of the authority for 2025.

#### Summary:

The Southwest Light Rail Transit (LRT) project (METRO Green Line Extension) will operate from downtown Minneapolis through the communities of St. Louis Park, Hopkins, Minnetonka, and Eden Prairie, passing in close proximity to Edina. It will be part of an integrated system of transitways, including connections to the METRO Blue Line, the Northstar Commuter Rail line, bus routes and proposed future transitways.

#### Purpose & Description:

This light rail extension will add system capacity in an area of high travel demand, due to existing and planned residential and employment growth. The competitive travel time is attributed to the diagonal nature of the line compared to the northsouth/eastwest orientation of the roadway network.

NOTE: The Regional Railroad Authority's total project contribution is \$199,548,000. This capital project budgetm authority only shows the Regional Railroad Authority's capital component of \$188.8 million. An additional \$10,791,418 of HCRRA funding was provided to the project through previous operating budgets or in-kind staff contributions. "Bonds - GO" is general obligation bonded indebtedness funded with Regional Railroad Authority property taxes.

The total project budget is \$2.495 billion. Additional contributions are committed from:

#### Summary:

The METRO Blue Line Extension project is a proposed 13-mile expansion of the existing METRO Blue Line in the Twin Cities area of Minnesota that will extend from downtown Minneapolis through north Minneapolis, Golden Valley, Robbinsdale, Crystal, and Brooklyn Park. serving the northwest Twin Cities metro. The Light Rail Transit will link to local and express bus routes, and will seamlessly connect to the regional transitway system at Target Field Station in downtown Minneapolis.

#### Purpose & Description:

The Blue Line Extension project is needed to effectively address long-term regional transit mobility and local accessibility needs while providing efficient, travel-time competitive transit service that supports economic development goals and objectives of local, regional, and statewide plans.

NOTE: The project budget only shows the Regional Railroad Authority's share of project costs. "Bonds - GO" is general obligation bonded indebtedness funded with Regional Railroad Authority property taxes.

The total estimated project cost is between \$2.9 billion and \$3.2 billion, which includes contingency of 35% to 45%. Contributions are anticipated from:

Current projections show a base cost for constructing the line at \$2.2 billion. To account for potential costs associated with unknown risks and conditions at this early design phase, the federal government also requires projects to add contingency costs between 35% and 45%. leading to a preliminary total cost range between \$2.9 billion and \$3.2 billion. These preliminary ranges are consistent with national trends in inflation and rising construction costs since the pandemic. The Blue Line Extension remains on the lower end of comparable projects around the country in terms of relative cost.

By the end of 2021, the project team aims to have a new route option that has the support of corridor residents, businesses, and cities. This alignment will then be advanced for environmental review and engineering work to be completed in coming years.


